Reaching conclusions without justification or unable to link facts together to provide a correct proof.	A correct approach to proving the problem is attempted. Right idea, but some flaws. Some statements may be unjustified or improperly justified, but errors are minor and could be fixed given time to polish the proof.	A correct and complete proof is given. All statements are mathematically sound and all reasons are correct. Some irrelevant information may be included due to time limitations.
