Code of Conduct Lab Work HLTH 4393

1. I work at San Antonio Orthopedic and Sports Clinic in San Antonio, TX as the head orthopedic surgeon.

2. My duties at this clinic would include:

- Consulting with patients
- Interpreting x-rays, MRI's, and CAT scans
- Ordering x-rays, MRI's, and CAT scans
- Setting up appointments with patients
- Rehabilitation with patients
- Working with nurses, physician assistants, and secretaries
- Writing up reports on patient injuries

A typical day at this clinic I would start my day by going over the previous day reports of the patients and doing follow up appointments and reviewing their lab work. I would then start doing patient consult which would include sending these patients to x-ray with a nurse or physician assistant and then interpreting the results. I would then delegate duties to the nurses and physical assistants such as lab work and giving steroid injection. After each patient I would write up a report and either refer them to get an MRI or CAT scan or have them schedule a follow up appointment after diagnosing their injury and giving them a treatment plan.

Article II:

Article IV:

Responsibility in the delivery of health education. Health educators promote integrity in the delivery of health education. They respect the rights, dignity, confidentiality, and worth of all people by adapting strategies and methods to meet the needs of diverse populations and communities.

The health educator is responsible for communicating and promoting health education in the proper way. They have to make sure that they present the information in the correct, polite, confidential, and politically correct way so that they don't insult the different culture of their diverse patient clientele.

This would apply in my clinic because I would receive a diverse range of population and cultural background so I am going to make sure that I communicate health education in a way that they can understand it but also so I don't offend them.
