Objective: In this course the student is expected to obtain an understanding of

trigonometric functions and their applications.

Description: Topics include coordinate systems, circular functions, solutions of triangles, trigonometric equations and inequalities, and the inverse trigonometric functions. Two years of high school algebra and high school geometry are prerequisites.

Textbook: Trigonometry, Fifth edition, C. McKeague and M. Turner

Exams, Quizzes/Homework, Final Exam, and Grade: There will be *3 exams, multiple quizzes/homework, and a final exam.* There are **no** make-up exams or quizzes/homework. You will get **0 points** for any exam or quiz that you miss, but be aware that the lowest exam grade and two lowest quiz grades will be dropped. The weights are as follows:

Exam average 60% (30% each, drop the lowest) Quiz/homework average 10% (drop the two lowest), Final exam 30%.

The grading scale is:

59% and below: F

I reserve the right to alter the scale if I feel it is necessary. **No extra credit** can be earned.

Cheating: Cheating will not be tolerated! Don't even think about it.

Calculator: A **minimum requirement** is a scientific calculator for numerical computations of trigonometric functions. A graphing calculator is helpful, but will not be

allowed on parts of some exams. Calculators with *computer algebra system* capabilities are not allowed in this class.
