# **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course is designed to provide students with a general understanding of common business principles and concepts. Students will be introduced to the *free-enterprise* system and examine basic business practices for owning and operating a business firm.

# **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

- Provide students with a basic knowledge of the *free-enterprise* system and understand how a business firm operates in a market economy.
- Discuss the allocation and management of economic resources for various forms of business ownership and organization.
- Establish a greater understanding of functional areas of business including management, marketing, accounting and financial management.

## COURSE EVALUATION

There will be four major examinations administered throughout the semester. In addition, there will be special assignments (quizzes, homework, project) which may require limited research and both written and arithmetic exercises. The grading procedure is:

# **MAJOR EXAMS**

Major Exams consist of 25 True False questions, 25 Multiple Choice questions, and appropriate application exercises. A ScanTron #882 will be required for each exam. All major exams will be "scheduled" and the FINAL EXAM schedule will be adhered to.
