<u>Course Description</u>: This course covers products and factoring of polynomials, algebraic functions, exponents and radicals, quadratic equations, functions and graphs, applications and systems of equations. Credit in this course may not be applied toward graduation or classification of students by hours completed.

<u>Assigned Text</u>: <u>Intermediate Algebra: Concepts and Applications</u>, Seventh Edition by Bittinger and Ellenbogen

<u>Class Attendance</u>: The attendance policy is according to that of SHSU. Regular and punctual class attendance is expected of each student, and records will be kept of student attendance. Your lowest unit test grade will be replaced by your final exam grade if this results in an improvement of your overall grade.

<u>Quizzes</u>: Quizzes will be given once a week; however, only the top ten quiz grades will be calculated in your final average.

<u>Participation and Professionalism</u>: Each student is expected to pay attention and follow instructions. Also, students should not disrupt the class for any reason, thus cell phones should be turned off. Students are encouraged to be on time, but if a student should happen to be late, come in and take a seat as quickly as possible so that you are not a disturbance to the rest of the class. No cheating is allowed on exams. If a student is caught cheating, the penalty for cheating is a zero on that assignment or exam.

<u>Makeup Policy</u>: If you expect to miss a test for any excusable reason, you must contact me in advance in order to schedule a makeup test. An unexcused absence on the day of a scheduled test will result in a grade of "0" for that test and may be replaced by your

final exam grade as mentioned above.
