*Papers. For the descriptive paper, choose a book from the list that will be provided. Write a descriptive review of 6-10 pages of text. A descriptive review involves explaining the thesis or major arguments of the book. About half the grade will be based on the quality of the writing – such as organization, style, and grammar. Use formal writing but don't be stilted. The other half of the grade will be based on the content -- such as explanation of the thesis and understanding of the arguments. The paper is due Sept. 18. Revision of this paper is optional. The analytical paper will use one or more of the data sets from the *Public Opinion* disk to analyze some aspect of political opinion or behavior. You will be given a great deal of advice, directions, and examples. The paper should be 6-10 pages of text. A rewrite is required. Again, half the grade will be based on the writing, half on the content. Papers will be submitted to Turnitin.com, a plagiarism checker.
