<u>Course Description</u>: This course is concerned with the principles and methods used in managing and operating organizations. Course coverage includes analysis of the organization's environment and the four basic managerial activities. The class will consist of lecture and class discussion. Students are expected to read assignments before class so that meaningful discussions in class can take place. Students are encouraged to share examples from their own experiences that relate to class material.
