Safety Item/Presentation/Paper

Bring and present a new safety item in class. The presentation should be 3-5 minutes in length. You may use Powerpoint or any other visual aid to enhance your presentation. At the time of the presentation present the instructor with a typed, one page outline identifying the item, history and its unique value and market price. The order for presentations will be randomly selected in class.

Safety Articles

Students will be asked to submit and write a brief review of a journal or news article dealing with some aspect of the safety issue. Topics and due dates will be discussed in class.

Section 51.911 (b) of the Texas Education Code requires that an institution of higher education excuse a student from attending classes or other required activities including examinations, for the observance of a religious holy day, including traveling for that purpose. A student shoes absence is excused under this subsection may not be penalized for that absence and shall be allowed to take an examination or complete an assignment from which the student is excused within a reasonable time after the absence.

University policy 861001 provides the procedures to be followed by the student and instructor. A student desiring to absent himself/herself from a scheduled class in order to observe (a) religious holy day(s) shall present to each instructor involved a written statement concerning the religious holy day (s). This request must be made in the first fifteen days of the semester or the first seven days of a summer session in which the absence (s) will occur. The instructor will complete a form notifying the student of a reasonable time-frame in which the missed assignments and/or examinations are to be completed.
