Objective

The purpose of this class is to understand the objectives, methods and organizational practices of secondary instrumental music.

Class Meetings

The scheduled time is MW from 10:00 am to 11:50 am. Field Observation as noted above will be scheduled independently. The class will also attend the U. I. L. Region IX Marching Contest on Tuesday, October 23, 2007 at the Conroe I. S. D. Moorhead Stadium. A full schedule will be made available when it is known.

Field Observations

Field Observation is an essential portion of the class content. Field Observation must conform to the requirements and guidelines of the SHSU College of Education and the policies of the organizations and teachers being observed. Documentation will be required for credit. Failure to meet or document the Field Observation will prevent a student from passing the class. Observations must be coordinated and approved by the professor.

Attendance

A significant portion of the class is dependent upon class participation. Further, many issues discussed will not be reflected in examinations and are not covered in a text. It is also anticipated that there will be guest lectures from professionals working in the field. Consequently, absence or tardiness will effect the student's final grade.

Four points will be deducted from the student's numerical grade for each unexcused absence. Two points will be deducted from the student's numerical grade for each tardy or incomplete class.

Recognizing that there are legitimate reasons to miss a class, an absence may be excused for grading purposes by permission of the professor. All requests for an excused absence will be made in writing at least two (2) weeks prior to the absence. Emergencies will be considered on a case by case basis. No work related absences will be excused.

Proper Classroom Demeanor and Rules of Conduct:
