## **Course Description and Objectives**

The purpose of this course is to provide an opportunity for students to gain an increased understanding and knowledge of safety consciousness, safety precautions and procedures in an industrial/construction environment. Specifically, the course will provide students an opportunity to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. Review and display an understanding of the historical perspectives of industrial safety.
- 2. Develop and display an understanding of the laws and regulatory agencies involved in construction and industrial safety.
- 3. Recognize and understand potential hazards in the work environment.
- 4. Locate and review resources available to safety professionals and those in supervisory positions in an industrial / construction environment.
- 5. Develop two tailgate safety projects based on a safety topic common to an industrial / construction environment (can be covered in 5 minutes).
- 6. Demonstrate understanding of common construction safety issues through participation in 4 online discussions.
- 7. Satisfactorily complete one onsite construction safety observation (TBA).
- 8. Exhibit an understanding of common construction safety topics through completed readings, papers, and Internet research projects.
