## • Course Description:

This course includes the study of integral calculus and its applications, including techniques of integration, improper integrals, infinite series and Taylor's formula.

Students taking MTH 143 must have received a grade of C or better in Math 142.

Each class will be primarily lecture-oriented.

### • Course Objectives:

Students completing this course should have mastery of the following major concepts. Other techniques and ideas will also be covered.

- (review of) the definite integral and the fundamental Theorem of Calculus
- applications of integration: volumes, surface area, length of curves, work
- transcendental functions defined as integrals
- techniques of integration: substitution, integration by parts, trig. substitution, partial fractions
- polar coordinates, parametric equations
- sequences: convergence
- series: convergence tests, power series

### • Required Textbook:

Thomas' Calculus, 11<sup>th</sup> Ed.: Early Transcendentals, by Finney, Weir and Giordano.

• Required Supplies: A graphing calculator - TI-83 recommended. Calculators with Computer Algebra Systems will not be allowed. If you have questions about your calculator, please see me.

• Attendance Policy: Students are expected to attend every class. If class must be missed, the student is expected to get the notes from a classmate, and to check the web-page for announcements and updated assignments.

Students are expected to arrive to class on time. If a student is perpetually late, they will be asked to not attend class unless they arrive on time. If tardiness becomes a problem for the class as a whole, people who arrive late will not be permitted to enter the class. If this stricter policy becomes necessary, there will be an announcement made in class and posted on the web-page under "Announcements".

# • Assignments:

1. **Homework:** Homework will be assigned in class each day, but not collected. Assignments can be found online.

It is your responsibility to ask questions about homework problems which you were not able to complete or did not understand. It is your responsibility to come to office hours, or otherwise contact someone for help. You may contact me via e-mail if you cannot make it to office hours, and I will try to answers questions as clearly as I can via e-mail. It is also your responsibility to do as many problems from each section as you need to in order to feel comfortable with the material.

- 2. Quizzes: There will be two quizzes each week.... some will be in the form of worksheets to be completed in small groups. No make-ups are allowed under any circumstances. To compensate for this, the lowest two quiz scores for the semester will be dropped.
- 3. Class participation: Students are encouraged to participate actively by asking and answering questions both in and out of class.
- Exams: There will be three exams during the semester. There will be no makeup exams, except for official University-sponsored activities.

The comprehensive final exam will be held on Wednesday, May 14, from 8:00 to 10:00.

• Grading Plan: The course grade is based on:

The course grade will be assigned via a standard 10-point scale. There is no additional curve in this class, and no extra credit, so keep up as the semester progresses.
