COURSE OBJECTIVES:

In this course we will study representative genres of literature: short fiction, the novel, poetry, drama, and film. Students should finish the course with a working knowledge of the similarities and differences of those genres and how the various themes of literature are portrayed differently in each. Students should also gain a working knowledge of major literary terms and devices which will assist them in future literature courses.

COURSE POLICIES:

Electronic devices:

No cell phones, cd players or any other electronic devices will be allowed in the classroom. **Laptops are allowed for note-taking only.** Students who use laptops for any other reason will lose their privileges to use these devices in class.

Dress code:
