Course description: This course is an introduction to formal methods of specifying, designing,

implementing and testing software for large programming projects. Topics of project management, risk management, estimating and predicting reliability are

discussed.

Course objectives: Training students with the knowledge of software engineering methodology and

with the ability to participate large-scale software projects

Prerequisite: CS334 (Database) and 3 hours of advanced CS course.

Textbook: Software Engineering by Roger Pressman, 6th edition, McGraw Hill.

Course requirements:

Assignments: The students will be required to do a team project, give presentations, and work

on other types of homework. All the homework is due in class on the due date, not midnight. Late homework is accepted up to one week with penalties (2% off on the due date but after class, 5% off on each additional day.) In general, student homework will be graded and returned back to students one week from

the due date.

Exams: Three exams, including the final exam, will be given. Students will be given at

least one week notice for the date of these exams. All the examinations are written examinations. There is no make-up examination available for any student. If a student has a good reason on missing an exam, the grade he/she receives from the following exam is counted for both. Students who fail to take both the first and the second exam, or fail to take the final examination fail the

class automatically unless excused for good cause by the college Dean.

First exam 15% (at about the end of February) Second exam 20% (at about the middle of April)

Class participation: Absences will not be used in computing the grade. However, according to the

university's policy, for classes that meet twice a week, a student who has two consecutive absences or a total of four absences will be resigned from the university unless excused for good cause by the student's academic dean.

Under no circumstances are cell phones or any electronic devices to be used or seen during times of examination. Students may tape record lectures provided they do not disturb other students in the process.
