<u>COURSE DESCRIPTION:</u> The purpose of this course is to give students an understanding of how to

evaluate business opportunities, create a new business and document t the

business experience.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Students will:

- 1. Demonstrate the ability to determine the factors necessary for a venture.
- 2. Analyze the industry related to the business concept.
- 3. Develop a personal entrepreneur's plan to demonstrate the viability of the students business concept in the marketplace.

COURSE EVALUATION PROCESS:

A grade for the course is based on weekly assignments, A Personal Entrpreneurial Plan(PEP) and a final exam. The weekly assignments will be reviewed and returned. The PEP is a binder containing the revised weekly assignment that defines your business plan.

- Weekly assignments 65% of grade Weekly assignments not submitted on time receive 50 % reduction 11ate day 75% on 2nd day late.

- Final Exam. 10%

Grades in this course are determined by applying the following scale to a student's average:

RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS POLICY:

Section 51.911(b) of the Texas Education Code requires that an institution of higher education excuse a student from attending classes or other required activities, including examinations, for the observance of a religious holy day, including travel for that purpose. The instructor will complete a form notifying the student of a reasonable time frame in which the missed assignments and/or examinations are to be completed.

CLASS & ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Attendance in this class is expected as is stated in the latest Sam Houston State University catalog. Those who miss a substantial number of classes will penalize themselves by missing material that will be discussed in class, that may not appear in the texts, and over which the class will be tested. Please come in if you are late and be seated quietly. If a student is consistently late, consistently late means greater than 3 times late, each late arrival in excess of 3 will be considered an absence. Absence in excess of 10 hours will result in the grade F for the semester. Students leaving class early without prior approval will be marked absent. Failure to be in class is an absence, there is no excused absence.

Absence does not excuse due date for assignments.

Students are considered to be learning how to become a part of the business community and are expected to dress and act accordingly. **No hats** are to be worn in the class room.
