## **Course Description**

Painting 1 introduces students to the materials and techniques of oil painting. Emphasis is placed on creative, personal expression in solving a series of problems that deal with color, representation, abstraction, structure, and content.

### **Course Objective**

The objective of this course is to give the student confidence with materials used in painting, an understanding of the variety of ways in which meaning is communicated through painting, and the ability to develop a personal style and individual conceptual direction.

# Methodology

There are 4 major projects to be completed and additional studies related to each problem. The assignments are accompanied by slide presentations, brief readings, demonstrations, and individual instruction. Completed work projects will be discussed in group critiques.

# Attendance is mandatory

According to University policy, a student may miss 3 hours before their final grade is affected.

In this course, you may miss two class periods before your final grade is affected. Use your absences wisely. I suggest saving them for when you are sick or absolutely unable to come to class. Please do not ask me if you can miss class for personal reasons. If you have 3 absences, your final grade will be lowered 5 points, 4 absences –10 points, 5 –15, 6 –20, 7 –25. If you miss more than 7 classes, you will not pass the course. Students who are more than 20 minutes late will be counted absent. Students are expected to remain in class the entire period. You

are responsible for all assignments and information given in class even if you are absent.

### Assignments, Exams and Grading

There are 4 major projects to be completed and additional studies related to each project. Each project is worth 25% of the final grade.

Project 1: Color and Composition

Small studies of ordinary objects done in monochromatic, complementary, and analogous color schemes.

Project 2: Image and Object

A photographic image will be used as source material for an abstraction and combined with an image painted from life.

Project 3: Self Portrait
An expressive representation of the self
