Objectives

- 1. This course is designed to give the student a basic background in factors that determine drug action and effectiveness. Students will learn about the following phenomena:
 - a. modes of administration;
 - b. distribution factors;
 - c. metabolism and elimination;
 - d. tolerance and dependence;
 - e. dose response curves.
- 2. The course is designed to give the student a basic understanding of neurochemical systems. Included under this objective are the following concepts:
 - a. basic structural aspects of neurons;
 - b. drug terminating mechanisms;
 - c. specific neurotransmitter systems.
- 3. The course will give the student an understanding of specific drug classes (i.e., sedative hypnotics, stimulants, opiates, psychedelics, and antipsychotics) and will investigate the behavioral effects of the use and abuse of those drug classes.
