COURSE DESCRIPTION

In this course we will be exploring the use of **found objects** in sculpture. We will be discussing the history of objects and how that affects content as well as how and why to alter the history of an object.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1) To help you build technical skills by experimenting with different processes.
- 2) To help you build a visual vocabulary by exploring beyond the tradition of a medium.
- 3) To help you build problem solving skills through challenging technical and conceptual problems.

TEXT

There is no required text for this class.

REQUIRED SUPPLIES

Materials for projects will be purchased by the students. A sketchbook is required for this class. Put this syllabus in your sketchbook and bring it to class every day.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance is mandatory. You are allowed two waived absences for the summer session - excused or unexcused. In other words, you will be allowed up to two absences without experiencing any effect on your grade. Any further absences will result in your final class grade being lowered one full letter grade for every absence over two.

This class starts at 8:00 am. I will take roll soon after that. If your not here when I take roll then your absent.

PROJECTS

There will be three projects in this class.

- 1) The Altered Book
- 2) Repetition of Object
- 3) The Container / Reliquary

I will be giving you handouts that explain these projects in full detail.

CRITIQUES

Show up ready to think, ask, and answer questions. Participation in critiques is part of your final grade, so make sure that you are ready to do so. Not may things can compare to the pain of a slow and silent critique.

All projects are due at the beginning of class on critique days. If any preliminary work or set-up needs to be done prior to critique, make sure you have arranged in advance to have it all finished and ready at the beginning of class. Any work brought in for critique once the crit has already begun will be considered late and will suffer the lowering of a full letter grade. All students are required to be present for all critiques. Failure to show up for a critique with an unfinished piece than to not show up at all. It is advisable however, that you do indeed make sure that your project is finished.

GRADING

The grade you earn on your projects will be determined on the following criteria:

- 1) Design and material inventiveness
- 2) Fulfillment of the project objectives
- 3) Physical investment

Late work will receive an automatic one-letter grade reduction.

If you have questions concerning your grade make an appointment to talk to me during my office hours.

Final class grades are based on the grades received for each project, and participation in the critiques and attendance.

Grades will be posted on Blackboard.

RELIGIOUS HOLY DAYS

Students are excused from attending classes or other required activities, including examinations for the observance of a religious holy day.
