

**Application for Transfer/Transient/Former Students** 

#### Instructions: Transfer/Transient/Former Students

- > Submit either a paper or an electronic application (www.applytexas.org), NOT BOTH. We encourage you to apply online.
- > A "transient" student is one who enrolls temporarily for a single course or one term only.

Enter Fall, Spring, Summer I, or Summer II, and enter the year you plan to begin attending.

\* Questions marked with an asterisk (\*) are optional, but including the information may assist your admittance. You are strongly encouraged to complete these questions.

#### Part I. Biographical Information

- Enter your Social Security number. The Social Security number is important to match the application with your grade transcript and test scores. The Social Security number is required to give (disburse) financial aid. NOTE: While no specific legal authority requires you to list your Social Security number for the purpose of applying for admission to the university, not providing the information will hold up further processes, such as financial aid.
- 2. Enter your date of birth (month, day, year). Do not leave blank; this information is required.
- 3. Enter your full, legal name: last, first, and middle. Do not use nicknames or abbreviations because this information will be used for your official record if you enroll. Use your full, legal name on all documents sent to the institution to which you are applying.
- 4. Enter other names, if any, under which your transcripts or other credentials may be listed. If you attended school using a different name or took a standardized college entrance exam using a different name, please list name(s).
- 5. Designate whether you are male or female.
- 6. Enter the city, state, and country where you were born.
- 7. This question is designed to identify your ethnicity and race. (a) Indicate whether or not your ethnicity is Hispanic or Latino. Check "yes" if you are a person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race. Check "no" if you are not. (b) Select the racial category or categories with which you most closely identify. Check as many as apply: White: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa. Black or African American: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa. Asian: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam. American Indian or Alaskan Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains tribal affiliation or community attachment.

- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.
- 8. Answer the questions regarding your citizenship status. If you have one, be sure to include with your application a copy of your permanent resident card and/or Notice of Action from the USCIS.
- 9. Indicate if you are connected to the military in any way by checking all categories that apply to you. If none apply, leave the question blank.
- 10. Enter your mailing/permanent mailing address and phone numbers. Use the Texas county codes and the two-letter state abbreviations listed on pages xix and xx. Use the county code if your permanent address is in Texas; if it is not, you do not need to provide a code.
- 11. Enter your physical address <u>only</u> if they are different from your permanent mailing address.
- 12. Enter phone number.
- 13. Enter the name, address, phone number, and email of an emergency contact person
- 14. Enter your E-mail address. The email address provided may be used to communicate important information to you regarding your application.
- 15. Indicate the highest level of your parents' or courtappointed legal guardians' educational background.
- \*16. Indicate what languages (other than English) you speak fluently and for what length of time you have spoken them.
- \*17. Indicate your family's gross income, including both taxed and untaxed income, for the most recent tax year.
- 18. Indicate type of application.
- 19. Enter the complete name of the high school from which you graduated, as well as the city and state where it is located. Enter the month and year you graduated. Indicate if you were home-schooled. Have an official transcript sent to each university to which you apply.
- 20. If you did not or will not graduate from high school, indicate whether or not you have a GED, whether it is the English or Spanish version, the month and year you completed the GED, and in what state you received it.
- 21. List all college or university courses in which you are presently enrolled, the institution you are attending, the department abbreviation, course numbers, dates taken, and course credit you expect to receive for these courses.

- 22. Indicate whether or not you graduated from high school in the top 10 percent of your class within the last two years
- 23. Indicate whether you are currently on academic suspension from any college or university.
- 24. Indicate if you are a member of Phi Theta Kappa, the honor society at community/junior colleges.
- 25. Indicate semester and year you anticipate to enroll.
- 26. Indicate whether you plan to pursue a pre-professional program (e.g., pre-law, pre-medicine, nursing, pre-dental, pre-veterinary, physical therapy, etc.).
- 27. Check "Yes" if you plan to seek a teaching certificate in addition to your degree and "No" if you do not. If "Yes," indicate if you will be seeking elementary level (Early Childhood-Grade 4), middle/junior high level (Grades 4-8); high school level (Grades 8-12); or all-level certification.
- 28. List the college or university courses you are currently enrolled in or courses you anticipate completing the semester or quarter prior to your transfer.
- 29. Indicate the date you took or plan to take one of the following tests for international students: the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or IELTS (International English Language Testing System) test.

#### **Residency Information**

- 35. Write down any additional information that would help your college or university classify you as a Texas

#### Part II. Additional Information

See pages ii through iv to determine if the university(s) to which you are applying requires this section. If it is required, provide complete information on employment, internships, and/or summer activities you have had that indicate your special interests, abilities, challenges, or achievements. You may submit a résumé in addition to this list. Attach it to your application and make a note that you have done so. Spell out names of organizations, clubs, honors, awards, etc.; do not use acronyms.

#### **Essays**

Most colleges and universities in Texas do not require essays as part of the admission process. Check the list on pages ii-v or the web site at www.applytexas.org. Be sure to include your name and Social Security number on each of your essay pages and enclose your essays with your application. If you apply electronically, also include on your essays the web identification number you are given.

#### **Application Fee**

Application fees are listed on pages ii-v. Include the student's name and Application ID number on your check or money order. Check the website of the institution(s) to which you are applying to see if credit card payment of the application fee is also accepted. Students with financial need should check with their high school counselor or the institution(s) to which they are applying for information concerning a possible waiver of the application fee (i.e., college application fee waiver).

If my application is accepted, I agree to abide by the policies, rules and regulations at any college to which I am admitted. I authorize the college to verify the information I have provided. I certify that the information I have provided is complete and correct and I understand that the submission of false information is grounds for rejection of my application, withdrawal of any offer of acceptance, cancellation of enrollment and/or appropriate disciplinary action. I understand that officials of my college will use the information submitted on this form to determine my status for residency eligibility. I authorize the college to electronically access my records regarding the Texas Success Initiative. I agree to notify the proper officials of the institution of any changes in the information provided.

Beginning on January 1, 2012, all entering students are required to show evidence of an initial bacterial meningitis vaccine or a booster dose during the five-year period preceding and at least 10 days prior to the first day of the first semester in which the student initially enrolls at an institution. An entering student includes a first-time student of an institution of higher education or private or independent institution of higher education and includes a transfer student, or a student who previously attended an institution of higher education before January 1, 2012, and who is enrolling in the same or another institution of higher education following a break in enrollment of at least one fall or spring semester.

A student is not required to submit evidence of receiving the vaccination against bacterial meningitis if the student submits to the institution:

- The student is 30 years of age or older by the first day of the start of the semester; or
- the student is enrolled only in online or other distance education courses; or
- the student is enrolled in a continuing education course or program that is less than 360 contact hours, or continuing education corporate training; or
- the student is enrolled in a dual credit course which is taught at a public or private K-12 facility not located on a higher education institution campus;
- the student is incarcerated in a Texas prison;
- An affidavit or certificate signed by a physician who is duly registered and licensed to practice medicine in the United States, stating that in the physician's opinion, the vaccination would be injurious to the health and well-being of the student; or
- An affidavit signed by the student stating that the student declines the vaccination for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief. A conscientious exemption form from the Texas Department of State Health Services must be used if the student is under 18 years of age, or living in on-campus housing. Students over 18, not living in on-campus housing can use a THECB form.

The form must be completed, notarized, and provided to the designated school official at the institution the student will be attending.

#### **Essays**

Institutions do not require all of the essays. See "General Application Information" on pages ii through v to determine if you are required to write an essay or essays as part of your application for admission. Unless otherwise specified, your essay(s) should be typed and be no longer than one page (8 1/2" x 11"). Put your name and Social Security number\* (see note below) at the top of each page.

**Topic A. Statement of Purpose**: The statement of purpose will provide an opportunity to explain any extenuating circumstances that you feel could add value to your application. You may also want to explain unique aspects of your academic background or valued experiences you may have had that relate to your academic discipline. The statement of purpose is not meant to be a listing of accomplishments in high school or a record of your participation in school-related activities. Rather, this is your opportunity to address the admission committee directly and to let us know more about you as an individual, in a manner that your transcripts and the other application information cannot convey.

**Topic B.** If you are applying as a former student and were suspended for academic reasons, describe briefly any actions you have taken to improve your academic abilities and describe why you should be readmitted. If you are applying as a nondegree-seeking or postbaccalaureate applicant, briefly describe the goals you wish to accomplish if admitted, including the courses you would like to enroll in.

**Topic C.** There may be personal information that you want considered as part of your admissions application. Write an essay describing that information. You might include exceptional hardships, challenges, or opportunities that have shaped or impacted your abilities or academic credentials, personal responsibilities, exceptional achievements or talents, educational goals, or ways in which you might contribute to an institution committed to creating a diverse learning environment

#### **Application Fee**

Application fees are listed on pages ii-v. Include the student's name and Application ID number on your check or money order. Check the website of the institution(s) to which you are applying to see if credit card payment of the application fee is also accepted. Students with financial need should check with their high school counselor or the institution(s) to which they are applying for information concerning a possible waiver of the application fee (i.e., college application fee waiver).
