Mission: Sam Houston State University provides high quality education, scholarship, and service to qualified students for the benefit of regional, state, national, and international constituencies.

Abbreviated History: Sam Houston State University (SHSU), located in Huntsville, Texas is a regional institution primarily serving the north Houston and east Texas regions attracting both entering freshmen and transfer students. The institution was created by the Texas Legislature in 1879 as Sam Houston Normal Institute to train teachers. The baccalaureate degree was first awarded in 1919. The name was changed to Sam Houston State Teachers College in 1923 and two years later, the college was admitted to membership in the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) as an accredited institution of higher learning. A graduate degree was authorized in 1936, and the curriculum was expanded to emphasize preparation in a variety of fields. In 1965, the institution's name was changed by the Texas Legislature to Sam Houston State College and again in 1969 to Sam Houston State University, due partially to an increase in the number of graduate degree conferred. In 1970, the University was granted permission to offer its first doctorate, a Ph.D. in Criminal Justice. For the just completed academic year, SHSU offered approximately 80 baccalaureate, 57 master's and 8 doctoral degree programs. Approximately 85% of the student body is at the baccalaureate level. Currently Sam Houston State University is organized academically into seven colleges: Business Administration, Criminal Justice, Education, Fine Arts and Mass Communication, Health Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences, and Sciences. Students are offered an extensive range of bachelor's and master's degrees, as well as doctorates in selected areas. The faculty and the University are recognized regionally, nationally, and internationally.

Peer Institutions: The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board has created five categories of peer group institutions in Texas for Universities. SHSU's peer institution in Texas are Texas A&M University – Commerce, Texas A&M University – Corpus Christi, Texas A&M University – Kingsville, Texas Southern University, Texas Women's University, and The University of Texas – Pan American.
