After completion of an initial two-year project studying post-tenure review in the Texas State University System, in the summer of 2000 I wrote an application for an AAHE funded follow-up grant. The application was successful, and so we were funded for an additional year to extend our research on post-tenure review to other state-supported universities in Texas during 2000-2001. TAMU, SFA, U of H, Texas Tech, UT Tyler, UT Arlington, and UT Pan American are all collaborated with the project.

"Post Tenure Review in the Texas State University System" was funded in 1998 as part of the New Pathways II project of the American Association of Higher Education. I was the principal investigator along with Dr. Debra Price. Other members of the SHSU PTR Research group are Dr. Laverne Warner, Dr. JoAnn Duffy, Dr. Paul Reed, Dr. Bill Fleming, and Dr. Dennis Longmire. This was a two-year project during which I led the team members in a study the operation of the post tenure review process first on the SHSU campus and then on the other campuses of the Texas State University System. The study employed a

combination of faculty surveys and structured interviews with key stakeholders, including legislators, administrators, and faculty.
