## Vice President for Academic Affairs and Professor of Sociology Sam Houston State University

1997-Present

- Led the Division of Academic Affairs with 519 faculty located in four colleges offering 91 undergraduate and 79 graduate degrees, including three doctoral degree programs.
- Brought to approval a revised institutional mission statement.
- Opened a multi-institution teaching center in north Houston offering seven bachelor's degrees and five master's degrees, which after three years serves 1,700 students each semester.
- Led a faculty development initiative more than quadrupling the number of semester- or year-long faculty development leaves.
- Designed and implemented a strategic planning process which received commendation from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools regional accreditation review team.
- Conducted a major revision of the university's core curriculum.

- Established and staffed a Center for Innovative Learning to assist faculty in applying high technology techniques to on-campus and distance instruction.
- Established the National Institute for Victim Studies in cooperation with Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD), which is supported by an annual federal set-aside of \$1,000,000.
- Connected all offices, classrooms, and residence hall rooms to the campus fiber optic backbone.
- Increased twelve-fold the student scholarship funds.
- Doubled the size of all graduate assistantships.
- Established an academic enrichment center to provide assistance to students in writing, reading, mathematics, and other basic skills.
- Brought to approval funding for an intrusive advising center, which will become fully operational fall 2002, and began the process of developing and staffing the center.
- Established and staffed an Office of International Programs which has doubled the number of international field schools and opened functioning student exchanges with six universities in its first two years.
- Developed and implemented a post-tenure review policy.
- Served on the executive board of the Alliance of Universities for Democracy and The Renaissance Group and the operations board of the Texas International Education Consortium.
- Served as an assessment consultant to the Association of Theological Schools, a curriculum consultant to develop Dar Al Hekma College (established 1999) in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia; a consultant to the Hungarian Ministry of Education; and a consultant to the Qatar Foundation for Education, Science, and Community Development in Doha Qatar.

### Vice President for Academic Affairs and Professor of Sociology Emporia State University

1989-1997

- Led the Division of Academic Affairs with a budget of approximately \$25 million and 275 faculty located in four colleges granting degrees in 35 undergraduate and 24 graduate areas including one doctorate.
- Led a two-year review of institutional mission, role and scope as well as a review of every
  academic program which resulted in substantial restructuring of academic programs and
  reallocation of associated budgets; and served as an active leader in other institutional
  strategic planning activities.
- Led a campus computerization program which placed a fiber optic, networked computer on each faculty member's desk, created 12 of the 14 student computer laboratories on campus, connected the campus network to the internet, and dramatically enhanced the electronic capabilities of the library.
- Led academic affairs affirmative action activities more than doubling the number of minority faculty.
- Led the establishment of an extensive faculty development program including the creation of a teaching enhancement center, a center for tele-educational support services, a faculty mentoring program, a week-long new faculty orientation program, and a graduate teaching assistant training program.
- Led the development of a nationally recognized outcomes assessment program.
- Led the establishment of a distance learning program which incorporates direct delivery and a variety of mediated instructional strategies, and established faculty development activities to support those programs.
- Participated in the establishment of an alliance with six community colleges and one vocational school to facilitate cooperation and coordination in a variety of areas from admissions to program articulation.
- Provided leadership in international and national higher education by serving as a member
  of the executive board of the Alliance of Universities for Democracy, and the Renaissance
  Group and serving as a consultant-evaluator and member of the assessment committee of
  the North Central Association.
- Provided leadership at the state level by serving twice as the chair of the Regents System Council of Chief Academic Officers and by being actively involved in legislative lobbying.

- Provided leadership with my family at the local level by serving in a variety of community organizations for which we were recognized as the 1994 Kansas Family of the Year, receiving the Kiwanis Outstanding Family of Builders Award.
