WHAT TRANSFER STUDENTS NEED TO KNOW

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To be considered for admission, students must have completed and submitted the following items to the Office of Admissions. SHSU does not accept faxed documents in consideration for admission.

Undergraduate students who transfer from another regionally accredited college or university with 12 or more transferable hours, must provide the following:

completed Apply Texas application or the SHSU Undergraduate Admissions Application with nonrefundable application fee

- official transcript indicating the completion of 12 or more transferable academic hours and a cumulative transfer grad point average of 2.0 or higher
- official transcripts from all colleges attended

Undergraduate students who transfer less than 12 transferable hours from another regionally accredited college, must meet the standards of beginning freshmen and provide the following:

- completed Apply Texas application or the SHSU Undergraduate Admissions Application with nonrefundable application fee
- official college transcript indicating the completion of less than 12 transferable academic hours and a cumulative transfer grade point average of 2.0 or higher
- official final high school transcript showing date of graduation and class rank (including ACT or SAT I scores)
- official transcripts from all colleges attended

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

TRANSFER STUDENTS SUBMIT:

- A \$35 nonrefundable application fee must be submitted with your application. Check, money order, or credit cards are acceptable forms of payment. Application fee will increase June 1, 2007.
- 2. Students transferring college credit must submit official transcripts from all colleges attended. Some colleges can send transcripts electronically. If an electronic transcript cannot be sent, request that an official copy be mailed to the SHSU Undergraduate Admissions Office, Box 2418, Huntsville TX 77341. Faxed or copied transcripts will not be accepted.

TRANSFER STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

Eligible students transferring from other colleges and universities must:

- Have earned a minimum of 12 transferable accredited semester hours of college level coursework,
- 2. Have a minimum overall transfer grade point average of 2.0, and
- 3. Not be on suspension from any other college or university.

ESTIMATED COST BY SEMESTER

FINANCIAL AID:

Approximately 50% of the student body receives financial assistance through federal, state, and local programs administered by the Student Financial Aid Office. Grants, loans, scholarships, college work-study programs, and a tuition payment plan are available to qualified students. To apply for financial aid at SHSU, students must submit the most current 'Free Application for Federal Student Aid' (FAFSA.ed.gov), designated supplemental applications, and forms to the address indicated on each individual form.
