COURSE DESCRIPTION: Continuation of SPN 263 with special emphasis on practical needs for communication. Prerequisite: SPN 263 or equivalent. A section may be reserved for native speakers. Credit 3.

GOALS OF THE COURSE: Part of the student's success will depend on arriving at class well prepared and able to respond quickly and correctly when called on. Communication with other students will be emphasized. Spanish 264 is also designed to further expand the student's proficiency in the four basic language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing.

PLACEMENT EXAM: If you have previous experience with the Spanish language, you should take the CLEP exam to determine your level and to gain credit by examination. Those wanting to take the CLEP exam should sign up with Ms. Terri Harvey, Testing Center, Tel 294-1221. She will schedule a time for you to take the exam.

NOTICE – The prerequisite for enrolling in SPN 264 is the completion of SPN 263 with a grade of C or higher or appropriate scores on the CLEP or AP examinations. The prerequisite for enrolling in upper-division Spanish courses is the completion of SPN 264 with a grade of C or higher or appropriate scores on the CLEP or AP examinations. However, if a graduating senior makes a D at this level, it will be accepted for graduation purposes.
