Spring 2008 Analysis of SACS Core Curriculum Composite Area 4 Objectives - HIS 265 and 266

The assessment plan for History included the use of two indicators: the IDEA student evaluations and the content-specific test scores on a sample of classes representing at least 20% of the students in HIS 265 during the Fall semesters and 20% of the students in HIS 266 during the Spring semesters.

The first indicator for measuring progress in realizing the Core Composite Area 4 Objectives comes from the student self-assessments of knowledge gained in this objective as a result of their enrollment in HIS 265 and HIS 266. A table of student Spring 2008 responses on item #21 on the IDEA instrument is provided below:

Conclusion: Student evaluations of content knowledge gained in both HIS 265 and HIS 266 were significantly higher than typical student evaluations of knowledge gained in other college classes taught in institutions that use the IDEA instrument. The benchmark goal for this indicator of progress was reached.

Owing to the timing of the creation of indicator 2, a pre-test was not given to the students in HIS 265 or HIS 266. Because the test is not normalized, without a pre-test it is not possible to quantify progress on meeting the objectives, and thus no post-test was given this semester.

Action Steps: Attention will be given to collecting pre- and post-test results in future semesters in order to have 2 indicators of progress toward meeting the objective.
