
# WHO IS A BEARKAT?

### THE MIND.


- Over 79 undergraduate degrees.


- Orientation sessions


- How can I make better grades? Predict my GPA?

### ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

### BEGINNING FRESHMAN STUDENTS SUBMIT:

- Completed online application for admission with a nonrefundable \$40 application fee.
- 2. Official ACT or SAT I scores required regardless of class rank.
- Official final high school transcript showing date of graduation and class rank.



### BEGINNING FRESHMAN STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

Eligible beginning freshmen students must graduate from an accredited\* high school and meet one of the following:

Students graduating from a non-accredited high school must meet requirements as listed in the SHSU Undergraduate Catalog.


### TRANSFER STUDENTS SUBMIT:

- 1. Completed online application for admission and a \$40 nonrefundable application fee.
- 2. Official transcripts on all previous coursework from ALL colleges or universities attended.


# TRANSFER STUDENT REQUIREMENTS:

Eligible students transferring from other colleges and universities must:

- 1. Have earned a minimum of 12 transferable accredited semester hours of college level coursework,
- 2. Have a minimum overall transfer grade point average of 2.0, and
- 3. Not be on suspension from any other college or university.

To apply for financial aid at SHSU, students must submit the most current 'Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA.ed.gov), designated supplemental applications, and forms to the address indicated on each individual form. 
Dorm life at SHSU has me spoiled and I'm loving every minute of it.


